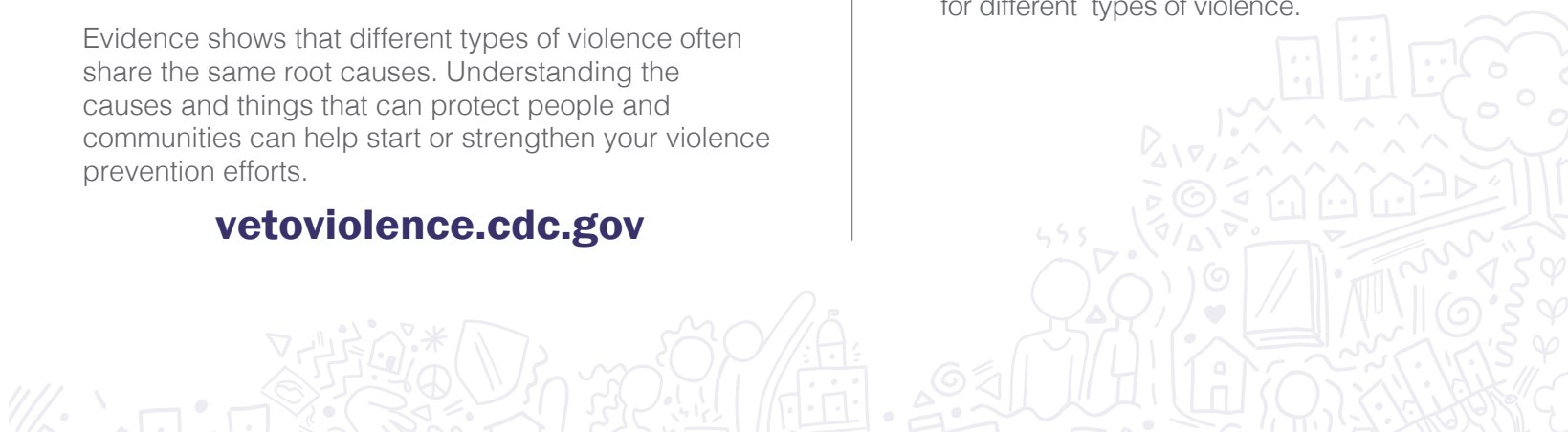
CDC's VetoViolence website has interactive tools, trainings, and resources to help you and your community stop violence now and prevent it in the future.
