

## CDC awards \$117 million to advance innovation and health equity as part of federal *Ending the HIV Epidemic in the U.S.* initiative

In July 2021, CDC awarded \$117 million to state and local health departments as part of the second major round of CDC funding delivered through the federal *Ending the HIV Epidemic in the U.S.* (EHE) initiative, which funds 57 priority areas to expand and tailor key HIV prevention strategies to community needs.
