Through its partnerships with state health agencies; federal agencies; academic institutions; and national, voluntary, and private sector organizations, DCPC is able to plan, direct, and support cancer control efforts.

In its commitment to reach target populations of persons at risk for developing cancer, DCPC focuses its cancer prevention and control efforts in six program areas: The National Program of Cancer Registries (NPCR), the National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program (NBCCEDP), the National Skin Cancer Prevention Education Program, the Colorectal Cancer Control Initiative, the Prostate Cancer Control Initiative, and the National Comprehensive Cancer Control Program.

To continue to satisfy its mission of developing effective cancer prevention and control strategies, DCPC has adopted the following priorities:

- Enhancing current surveillance systems
- Increasing research and evaluation to broaden the use of science
- Developing new approaches to improve the delivery of public health interventions
- Building the scientific and programmatic capacity in state, territorial and American Indian/Alaska Native health agencies
- Providing leadership in the application of effective strategies for cancer prevention and control
- Working with other CDC programs and partners to reduce morbidity and mortality from cancer
