


OVERVIEW

The IETA program is a 12-month competency-based program offered by CDC's Global Health Center. It is designed to offer HHS employees the opportunity to gain global public health experience, while providing technical assistance to CDC country offices and partners. Selected applicants participate in several week-long workshops and a 12-week minimum international field assignment in a country where CDC works.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Full-time HHS employees (FTEs and U.S. Public Health Service Commissioned Corps officers) at the GS-11 grade / O-3 rank and above are eligible for the IETA program. The IETA program seeks applicants from a wide variety of professional backgrounds including administration, communications, laboratory science, policy, program implementation, and surveillance. All applicants must be in their current position for 12 or more consecutive months at the time of application and receive written permission from their first-level and second-level supervisor.
