

- Tribal traffic laws and policies, a quantitative assessment

- Crow Tribe Motor Vehicle Crash Site Identification Project
- The IHS Provider, June 2012, pages 153-156
- Project led to tribal request for Road Safety Audit
 - Audit includes single-or multiple vehicle involvement, weather conditions, alcohol involvement, occupant restraint use

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

Tribal projects

- CDC Tribal Motor Vehicle Injury Prevention Program
 - 2010-2015
 - 5 of 8 tribes addressed impaired driving
 - 5 programs implemented sobriety checkpoints
 - 5 programs worked on BAC laws
 - IHS Tribal Injury Prevention Cooperative Agreement Program
 - 1997 present

WHAT IS TIPCAP?

TIPCAP-funded Tribes are awarded multi-year funding to develop programs based on evidence-based, public health strategies in injury prevention.

In the last 20 years, TIPCAP has:

Established 99 dedicated injury prevention positions in AI/AN communities

Awarded \$29 million to tribes and tribal organizations from 1997-2017
 \$31 million will be awarded by the end of 2020

TIPCAP DUI PREVENTION

• Examples

- 2004 2006: Ute Tribe
 - No DUI enforcement checkpoints for decades prior to TIPCAP
 - 340 DUI arrests after program began
 - Number of alcohol-related crashes declined from 32 to 21 during project period
- 2010-2015: Menominee Tribe of Wisconsin
 - Overall injuries from MVCs involving alcohol decreased from 75% to 33%
- 2016-2020: Northern Cheyenne
 - Teen-focused impaired driving prevention activities

Reservation east of Phoenix
10,000-12,000 residents
Tribal Police Department
12 -28 fulltime police officers



2004-2009: CDC TMVIPP
2009-2010: Funded by Tribe
2010-2015: IHS TIPCAP
2016-2018: BIA



Program implementation

- Community awareness and outreach
- 390 Task Force
- DUI enforcement checkpoints
- Lower BAC limit
- Incentive program for officers
- Primary occupant protection law



2004-2013 Results

- 3,835 DUI arrests
- MVC crashes decreased 5%-7% per year
- Annual percentage change
 - Total MVCs: -6.34
 - Nighttime MVCs: -7.43
 - MVCs with injuries/fatalities: -5.37
 - Nighttime MVCs with injuries/fatalities: -6.89

San Carlos Motor Vehicle Crashes 2002-2010 -All MVCs **Number MVCs** -No Injury MVCs -Nightime MVCs ---------—Injury MVCs -Fatal MVCs

SAN CARLOS PROGRAM

- Cost Benefit Study (2001-2008)
 - Medical care and productivity losses totaled more than \$57 Million
 - \$1 spent on MVIP saved \$9.86 total costs
 - Total = <u>\$2.7 million saved</u>

2019 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

- New tribally-funded Safety Coordinator position
 - Child passenger safety
 - DUI planned activities
 - Enhanced enforcement
 - Participate in national Dui campaigns
- IHS role:
 - Data collection and analysis
 - Technical assistance on countermeasure implementation
