#### Extramural Research Program Highlight

#### Peer Reviewer Survey

- OMB Approved Survey of Reviewers Since 2018
- Quantitative and Qualitative Data
- Notable FY19 Survey Results
  - 83% Response Rate among 111 serving reviewers
  - No notable difference in responses across 7 peer review panels
  - 97% agreed panel reviews were managed in a fair and unbiased way, appreciated the CDC leadership, and quality of the discussions for scientific merit of applications.
    - Individual qualitative feedback: "Panel members were extremely well-prepared and professional. The Scientific Review Official and Chair were professional and knowledgeable and ensured a fair, effective review."
  - 72% indicated they would be very likely to serve on an NCIPC panel again.














CDC Strategic Framework for Opioid Use Disorder and Overdose Prevention:

## Extramural Research Program Highlight NOFO Topic Areas Addressed by Opioid Research Awards






#### NCIPC Extramural Research Funding History FY2009-2019





#### NCIPC Opioid Use Disorder and Overdose Prevention Extramural Research Funding FY2009-2018




#### NCIPC Sexual and Intimate Partner Violence Prevention Extramural Research Funding FY2009-2018




#### NCIPC Youth Violence Prevention Extramural Research Funding FY2009-2018
