





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State Support: Prescription Drug Overdose

In FY 2016, CDC awarded over \$50 Million to states to support the fight against the opioid overdose epidemic. CDC's investment now includes 44 states and the District of Columbia.



State Support: National Violent Death Reporting System (NVDRS)

On September 1st, 2016, CDC announced new awardees for NVDRS. The additional \$2.1 million in funding will expand NVDRS from 32 to 42 participating states and territories, enabling greater collection of critical data on violent deaths.


