Race & Violence Workgroup (RVW)

2015

 Began informally after 9 African Americans were murdered during bible study in Charleston, South Carolina

2016

 Formalized to enhance DVP's approach to addressing the unequal burden of violence experienced by racial/ethnic minorities

2017

 Conducted assessment of DVP publications, results illustrated the need to more intentionally address inequities

2018-2020

 Developed recommendations, began working with leadership to foster dialogue, build capacity, and establish supportive policies in DVP

 - Enhanced language and emphasis in NOFOs
 - Equity criteria in Performance Management Appraisals

General Elements

- Violence Topic Area
- Population
- Partnerships

Equity Specific Elements

- Mention of inequity, race, racial inequity, socio-economic inequity, SOGI inequity
- Analysis to assess inequities
- Plans to disseminate results to communities studied
- Plans to disseminate results to other high risk populations

Systematic Review of the Literature

Systematic Review

- Develop dashboard that can be used to guide:
 - Intra-mural and extra-mural research and surveillance and enhance DVPs approach to:
 - Addressing critical gaps in knowledge
 - Tracking trends related to racial/ethnic inequities;
 - Identifying social determinants that drive elevated risk;
 - Identifying effective interventions and policies to eliminate racial/ethnic inequities
 - Development of scientific and programmatic technical assistance

Next Steps

NOFO Assessment

- Complete review pilot
- Conduct coding for NOFOs and Awards
- Conduct analysis
- Discuss results and implications for NOFO language (RVW, DVP, & ERPO)
- Share results with the BSC in December 2020

Systematic Review

- Solidify parameters of systematic review
- With assistance of contractor, use machine learning methods to identify relevant articles
- Complete review by September 2021
- Discuss results and implications for DVP
 - Research agenda
 - Funding announcements
 - Research and programmatic technical assistance
