
State Profile: Rhode Island

Parent-Reported Diagnosis of ADHD by a Health Care Provider and Medication Treatment Among Children 4-17 Years: National Survey of Children's Health* – 2003 to 2011

Survey Question

Has a doctor or health care provider <u>ever</u> told you that your child had attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder or attention deficit disorder (ADHD or ADD)?



Does your child <u>currently</u> have ADHD or ADD?

In 2007, 7.2% of US children and 9.4% of children in Rhode Island had *current* ADHD, by parent report.



Among all US states, Rhode Island ranked 10th highest.

In 2011, 8.8% of US children and 11.1% of children in Rhode Island had *current* ADHD, by parent report.



Among all US states, Rhode Island ranked 11th highest.

Is your child <u>currently</u> taking medication for ADHD or ADD? In 2007, 4.8% of US children and 7.1% of children in Rhode Island were taking medication for ADHD.



Among all US states, Rhode Island ranked 8th highest.

In 2011, 6.1% of US children and 6.3% of children in Rhode Island were taking medication for ADHD.



Among all US states, Rhode Island ranked 28th highest.
