Dr. Dean is Deputy Director of NCHHSTP and Dr. Williams, is a Behavioral Scientist in the Division of HIV/AIDS Prevention, NCHHSTP, and serves as Co-Chair of the NCHHSTP Health Equity Work Group.

Deadline for submission: May 1, 2012. The anticipated publication date for this *PHR* Supplement is May/June 2013.

For the Supplement on PCSI, Gustavo Aquino, Associate Director for Program Integration, NCHHSTP, is also a guest editor.

Deadline for submission: July 1, 2012. The anticipated publication date for this *PHR* Supplement is July/August 2013.
