9 TIPS FOR BETTER PRESENTATIONS

- 1. <u>Focus your topic</u>. Resist the temptation to throw in everything you know. Mark my word: If you try to say everything, the audience will probably remember nothing.
- 2. Analyze your audience. What do they need? What do they want?
- 3. <u>Target your research</u>. Use variety: strong statistics, specific examples, comparisons, definitions, etcetera.
- 4. Organize your material. Make it easy to follow.
- 5. <u>Simplify your language</u>. Make it easy to understand. (Don't say "at this particular point in time." Say "now.")
- 6. Give it some style. Try: rhetorical questions, triads, parallel structure, repetition.
- 7. <u>Use humor; don't abuse humor</u>. Remember: You never get the chance to "un-do" a tasteless joke.
- 8. <u>Allow enough rehearsal time to IMPROVE your delivery</u>. It's not what you say ... it's how you say it.
- 9. <u>Consider media coverage</u>. Every word you say could be repeated. Think before you speak.
