Australian, Sydney	Australia	NCCH has the capacity to provide ICD-10 morbidity and mortality coding in countries of the Western Pacific, Southeast Asia and African Regions. NCCH will continue to Provide ICD-10-AM Training for Trainers and clinical coders in Australia and New Zealand
Australian, Brisbane	Australia	NCCH Brisbane has substantial capacity and experience, limited only by funds, timing and availability. We also have a network of interested Australian educators and clinical coders that we are able to call on to conduct international courses on our behalf.
Brazil	Brazil	We are able to conduct course in other Portuguese and Spanish countries – as it was already done – or to receive peoples from Portuguese or Spanish speaking countries (it has already happened).

Nordic, Uppsala	Sweden	<p>Our Centre is primarily working with the Nordic countries but we also provide supporting services to the Baltic States. Many of the individuals working at the Nordic Centre have been heavily involved in and even responsible for national ICD-10 training activities in their own countries (Gunnar Schioler in Denmark, Martti Virtanen in Finland, Glen Thorsen in Norway and Bjorn Smedby and Lars Age Johansson in Sweden). They have also been participating as teachers in regional and local training activities arranged by others, such as hospital owners, universities (e.g. formal courses at Göteborg University, Sweden) and medical record officers' associations. This has not been part of their functions at the Nordic Centre, however, but performed in other national, professional roles or in personal capacity.</p> <p>We have discussed the possibility of providing courses on automated coding of death certificates to Nordic and Baltic countries. There is an interest for this topic and Swedish experience (Lars Age Johansson) could be</p>

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		used for this. However, so far there are no time and other resources available for this. (This last answer mainly refers to the mortality part of this questionnaire)
Tokyo	Japan	Mortality coding: coders in the Ministry do all work on mortality coding. There is no need for preparing training course for persons outside Ministry. But many persons from overseas come to see Japanese systems related to vital statistics such as auto coding system. Morbidity coding: We do not conduct any training now. Although some academic society prepares training course for morbidity coding by using an original textbook made by the society, this is focused on training of domestic coders from our understanding.
