As part of its mission to provide information on the health status of the American people, the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has been conducting the National Hospital Ambulatory Medical Care Survey (NHAMCS), an annual study of hospital-based outpatient care, since 1992. The NHAMCS is an extension of the National Ambulatory Medical Care Survey (NAMCS), which collects similar data from physicians in office-based practices.

Collecting data in hospitals, such as your own, is necessary to keep updated information on the status of ambulatory care provided in hospitals across the country. The purpose of this study is to collect information about the large portion of ambulatory care that is provided by hospital outpatient departments and emergency departments. The information requested includes patient demographic data, diagnoses, and the treatment and services provided. The resulting published statistics will help hospital staff and other medical professionals plan for more effective health services, improve medical education, and assist the public health community in understanding the epidemiology of diseases and health conditions. In addition, as a result of the September 11, 2001, attack on our Nation and the subsequent incidents of bioterrorism, NCHS has added some new supplements in 2003 to assess the bioterrorism and mass casualty preparedness of U.S. hospitals and to evaluate the problem of emergency department crowding and surge capacity.

As the enclosed letters of endorsement attest, data on ambulatory care provided in hospital settings are essential to meet the needs of the hospital industry and medical profession. These data are being provided through the participation of hospitals throughout the Nation. Data collection for the NHAMCS is authorized by the Public Health Service Act (Title 42, United States Code, Section 242k). Participation is voluntary. Although there are no penalties for not participating, each nonresponse makes the national statistics less accurate. All information collected is held in the strictest confidence and will be used only to prepare statistical summaries. Please be assured that there are several ways that the Privacy Rule (as mandated by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act [HIPAA]) allows you to participate. Disclosures of patient data are permitted for public health purposes and for research that has been approved by an Institutional Review Board – both of which apply to this survey. We invite you to visit our respondent Web site ([www.cdc.gov/NHAMCS](http://www.cdc.gov/NHAMCS)) for information on the survey including important policies and procedures regarding confidentiality and meeting the HIPAA Privacy Rule requirements.
