I worked at IBM Endicott from [redacted] primarily in equipment maintenance in building  
I worked on the plating lines and was exposed to all the chemicals used in the plating process. I handled  
pumps, plumbing, welded plating tanks and all the chemicals used.  
I was laid off in [redacted] due to downsizing and subsequently was diagnosed with kidney cancer in  
I had a radical left nephrectomy, removing my left kidney and part of my intestines. I had a tumor inside  
my kidney the size of a nerf football. It was a stage 4 carcinoma, it would have been deadly if it had  
broken out of the kidney walls.  
I have CAT and PET scans every 6 months to ensure the cancer has not returned.  
I did not smoke or was exposed to any other materials that would cause this cancer.  
I would like to be added to any inquiry as to the responsibility of IBM and feel like their negligence has  
something to do with my cancer and lifelong medical problems.
