

**About the condition names and codes**

The PHIN Notifiable Condition Mapping Tables (PHIN NCMTs) include a spreadsheet called *Notifiable Conditions 2004.xls*. This spreadsheet contains conditions and codes from the Nationally Notifiable Disease Surveillance System (NNDSS). The Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists (CSTE) and CDC’s Epidemiology Program Office (EPO) maintain the NNDSS Event Code List and update it annually.

**Condition codes and condition status**

NNDSS codes are available for all nationally notifiable conditions. There are also some NNDSS codes for conditions that are notifiable at the state level. Some state-notifiable conditions, however, do not have NNDSS codes.

NNDSS Code	NNDSS Status	Condition Name
10130	NND	Malaria
12020	State	Toxoplasmosis
10140	NND	Measles (rubeola)
no code	State	Marburg virus infection
10010	inactive	Aseptic meningitis

The table above shows some rows from *Notifiable Conditions 2004*.

Nationally notifiable conditions – Malaria and Measles, like all nationally notifiable conditions, have NNDSS codes and a status of NND.

State notifiable with NNDSS codes – Toxoplasmosis is not nationally notifiable but it does have an NNDSS code.

State notifiable without codes – Marburg virus infection does not have an NNDSS code. States in which Marburg virus infection is notifiable use their own codes for in-state reporting.

Inactivated conditions – There are some non-notifiable conditions in this table with a status of “inactive.” These conditions were notifiable at the state or national level in the past. At the present time they are not nationally notifiable and do not need to be reported to CDC. No LOINC codes are mapped to these conditions in the *LOINC to Condition* table.
