Course Description

This two-day course provides the most current information available in the constantly changing field of immunization. It offers a comprehensive overview on immunization, general recommendations, vaccine storage, handling and administration. It discusses the vaccines currently recommended to protect against vaccine-preventable diseases. The course also highlights emerging issues in the field.

The training will be conducted from 8:00am to 5:00pm both days. You should plan to attend all sessions if you wish to receive CE credit. A block of rooms at the hotel hosting the event has been reserved. To eliminate the need for a registration fee, lunch will **not** be provided.

Goal To improve immunization practices in the United States.

5. For each vaccine-preventable disease, describe characteristics of the vaccine used to prevent the disease.
6. Describe an emerging immunization issue.
