What is Marburg?

 Up to 9 out of 10 people infected with the virus will die without treatment.




 Chances of survival improve when treatment is given early at a treatment center.

What Happens Next?


 Over the next 21 days, I will visit you each day to look for the signs and symptoms of Marburg and answer any questions you have.

What Should You Do if You Feel Sick?

- Notify a health worker. Chances of survival improve when treatment is given early at a treatment center.
- Stay home while you wait for an ambulance to take you to the treatment center where you will be treated.
- Until help arrives, avoid contact with your friends and family to prevent spreading the virus to them.





What Happens if You Go to a Treatment Center?
