2014 NATIVE HAWAIIAN AND PACIFIC ISLANDER (NHPI) NATIONAL HEALTH INTERVIEW SURVEY (NHIS)

What is the Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander (NHPI) National Health Interview Survey (NHIS)?

The NHIS is the nation's largest in-person household health survey. It is conducted annually by the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS), which is a part of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and the U.S. Census Bureau.

In 2014, about 4,000 extra households containing one or more NHPI residents will be added to the NHIS. If you are selected, the Census Bureau will contact you.

Why is the NHPI NHIS important to you, your family, and your community?

The NHPI NHIS is an unprecedented opportunity to collect rich and accurate information about the health of Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders in all 50 states. With the information collected, it will be possible for policymakers, community leaders, researchers and health professionals to understand NHPI health problems, strengths, and needs and to plan policies and programs to improve NHPI health and well-being.

Your information will always be kept confidential. The data, stripped of all identifying information, will be available to everyone for statistical purposes.
