Enactment of EEOICPA


- Enacted October 2000
 - Part B, mandatory federal entitlement, by DOL
 - Part D, state workers comp. assistance, by DOE
- Amendments October 2004
 - Abolished Part D, created federal Part E, transferred to DOL
- 174,993 cases filed, over \$10.9 billion total compensation paid to date
- Agencies: Labor, Energy, HHS, Justice
- DOL locations
 - DC, Jacksonville, Cleveland, Denver, and Seattle

Part B – Status & Location of NIOSH Referrals


- 42,793 Cases Referred to NIOSH for Dose Reconstruction
- 40,797 Cases Returned by NIOSH
 - 34,910 with Dose Reconstruction
 - 5,887 without Dose Reconstruction
- 1,996 Cases Currently at NIOSH

- 34,910 Cases returned by NIOSH w/ a Dose Reconstruction (DR)
- 28,133 Cases w/ DR and a Final Decision
 - 9,937 Final Approvals (POC 50% or Greater)
 - 18,196 Final Denials (POC less than 50%)




Part B Cases Filed


