- Area IV of the Santa Susanna Field Laboratory (SEC-00093) year 1965 is being addressed with SEC-0234 being presented at this meeting



- Savannah River Site (SEC-00103) NIOSH and Sanford Cohen & Associates (SC&A) update is scheduled for this meeting
- Los Alamos National Lab (SEC-00109) NIOSH update is scheduled for this meeting



- Grand Junction Facilities (SEC-00175) additional data capture and interviews are required to address recent SC&A findings
