- Cases Accepted Based on SEC Status and POC ≥ 50% 885
 - > \$132.7 Million in Compensation
- Totals: All Accepted SEC, Dose Reconstruction Cases, and Combined – 34,731
 - > \$5.1 Billion in Compensation


Status & Location of NIOSH Referrals

 - > 559 Reworks or Returns




Chart - Part B Cases w/ a Final Decision




Top Four Worksites


