

Enactment of EEOICPA


- Enacted October 2000
 - Part B, mandatory federal entitlement, by DOL
 - Part D, state workers comp. assistance, by DOE
- Amendments October 2004
 - Abolished Part D, created federal Part E, transferred to DOL
- 146,120 cases filed, over \$7.3 billion total compensation paid to date
- · Agencies: Labor, Energy, HHS, Justice
- DOL locations
 - DC, Jacksonville, Cleveland, Denver, and Seattle



HHS added SEC classes

- 2,976 cases withdrawn from NIOSH for SEC class review:
 - 2,617 Final Decisions issued 2,530 Final Approvals

 - 19 Recommended but no Final Decision
 - 72 Cases Pending
 - 268 Cases Closed

SEC Class Implementation Overview

 NIOSH sends letter to DOL sharing draft language for new SEC class definition:

Occurs a few weeks before NIOSH presents SEC class to the Advisory Board on Radiation and Worker Health (ABRWH)

 DOL sends letter to NIOSH with comments on the draft SEC class definition, if applicable:

> Improves the consistency and fairness of claims adjudication Speeds the process of determining which cases should be considered a part of the new SEC class

<u>DOL does NOT comment on whether a new SEC class is necessary</u>

SEC Class Implementation Overview (Cont'd)

- DOL produces draft EEOICP circular:
 - Draft EEOICP circular is produced after ABRWH makes its recommendation on the new SEC class definition
- Draft EEOICP circular is based on NIOSH SEC Petition Evaluation Report

Reasons for the new SEC class and the SEC class definition are taken directly from the NIOSH SEC Petition Evaluation Report

Many of the policies and procedures used by DOL when evaluating claims are the same for each SEC class

SEC Class Implementation Overview (Cont'd)

• SEC classes may not cover "all workers:"

Limited by monitoring status – was monitored or should have been monitored" (examples: LANL, LLNL)

Limited by work location, division, or building (examples: Ames Lab, LANL, tech areas)

Limited by job title (examples: Ames Lab sheet metal workers, Iowa Ordnance Plant radiographers)

Limited by certain process or operation (example: Iowa Ordnance Plant process area (Line 1), Y 12 Plant cyclotron operations)

- DOL relies on DOE records to place individuals in covered buildings, areas, etc., but often the records are not specific enough
- DOL includes in the circular a list of records that can be used when establishing membership in a SEC class

SEC Class Implementation Overview (Cont'd)

 Once HHS' Letter to Congress regarding the SEC Petition is sent – DOL's EEOICP circular is placed in final form

Circular must go through concurrence process

- Division of Energy Employees Occupational Illness Compensation (DEEOIC)
- Office of the Solicitor
- Office of Workers' Compensation Programs
- <u>DOL's Goal to have circular finalized by SEC class</u> effective date

NIOSH Referral Case Status


- 35,377 Cases Referred to NIOSH for Dose Reconstruction
- 32,907 Cases Returned by NIOSH that are Currently at DOL
 - 28,810 with Dose Reconstruction
 - 4,097 without Dose Reconstruction
- 2,470 Cases that are Currently at NIOSH
 - 1,823 Initial Referrals to NIOSH
 - 647 Reworks or Returns to NIOSH

NIOSH Dose Reconstruction Case Status

- 28,810 Cases returned by NIOSH that are currently at DOL w/ a Dose Reconstruction (DR)
- 23,941 Cases w/ DR and a Final Decision

8,329 Final Approvals (POC 50% or Greater) 15,612 Final Denials (POC less than 50%)

- Accepted DR Cases 7,837

 11,058 Payees
 \$ 1.16 Billion in Compensation
- Accepted SEC Cases 14,109 23,449 Payees \$2.09 Billion in Compensation
- Cases Accepted Based on SEC Status <u>and</u> POC 50% or Greater–510 638 Payees \$76 Million in Compensation
- Totals: All Accepted SEC and DR Cases 22,456 35,145 Payees
 \$3.3 Billion in Compensation

DEEOIC SEC Outreach

- In response to new SECs DEEOIC conducted:
 - 6 Town Hall Meetings and 8 Traveling Resource Centers during FY '10 and '11
- In cases of smaller SECs press releases are issued

Outreach to Covered Facilities (50 claims or less filed)

- Identified several covered facilities where less than 50 claims have been filed
 - Majority AWE facilities
- Concentrating efforts to notify individuals who worked at these facilities of potential EEOICPA benefits
 - Issuing press releases
 - Reaching out to unions, local government, other key stakeholders
 - Utilizing Resource Center staff

Use of the Ruttenber Database for the Rocky Flats Plant Neutron SEC Class

- Database from the epidemiological studies conducted by the Ruttenber team at the Colorado Department of Public Health and the Environment.
- The Ruttenber study relied on the dosimetry records provided by the Rocky Flats radiation protection department to calculate unmonitored neutron dose.
- DOL will use the database as a resource for:
 - Placing employees in the Rocky Flats SEC buildings and/or
 - For determining whether they were exposed to 100mrem+ of neutron in any calendar year, i.e., the level of "should have been monitored for neutron exposures" in the SEC definition.

DOL Implementation of Ames Laboratory SEC Class

- During NIOSH Advisory Board telephone meeting on July 11, 2011 NIOSH proposed a SEC class for all workers for the period from January 1, 1942 through December 31, 1970, based on the inability to bound internal thorium and other radionuclide exposures.
- This new class subsumed three already existing SEC classes.
- The Board deferred a decision hoping to get additional details from DOL as to who is covered by the SEC class, i.e., which University personnel are covered, including non technical personnel, e.g. housekeeping, etc.

DOL GPRA Goals


- New goal FY 2012

- Baseline FY 2011




Top Four Worksites
