I want to thank you for your help. The information and encouragement you have given me have meant so much. I am enclosing my SEC Petition and have enclosed Exhibits with documentation which I hope will give an understanding of the facts concerning employment at Mathieson Chemical Company. I welcome the opportunity to submit this claim.

As I have told you, when I filed my claim in 2002, I did not give complete information or explanation of information as I should have done because I thought much of this information would have to come from the Company or the Government. I was surprised to learn that no records were kept. I had been told that the EEOICPA had been passed to compensate victims like my husband and me. By the time I realized what information would be significant, my claim had already been denied. It was my understanding that the Dose Reconstruction Report could not be questioned for any reason. I was told that I was challenging the law. I was not challenging the law, but I was challenging the manner in which my claim was handled. I wish to bring the enclosed information to your attention.

I am submitting new evidence. Many changes have been made relating to the EEOICPA since the last action was taken on my claim in 2005. New

information has been found and new research has caused revisions to Technical Bulletins.

I am respectfully requesting consideration of this claim and will appreciate your advice and assistance. I believe that my claim meets all the requirements for designation as a Special Exposure Cohort.
