


## National Partners Form a Powerful Network to Reduce Immunization Disparities and Increase Community-Level Engagement

Through the *Partnering for Vaccine Equity* program, CDC allocated **\$62.7M** (fiscal year 21-22) to eight national organizations with longstanding ties with specific communities to enact sustainable change for communities of color experiencing immunization inequities.

Since 2021, these organizations have **implemented vaccination activities**, **deployed educational campaigns**, **and equipped influential messengers in their local branches/affiliates** to engage communities experiencing immunization inequities. To support these efforts, CDC provides national partners access to a learning community with other partners, data insights on key health and demographic data, and a repository of vaccine promotion and educational resources.
