



## Are you eligible for no-cost health care related to your 9/11 experience?

You could be eligible for 9/11-related health care if you volunteered, performed response and recovery efforts, or otherwise responded to 9/11 in New York City, at the Pentagon, or at the Shanksville, Pennsylvania sites. The World Trade Center (WTC) Health Program provides no-cost medical monitoring and treatment for certified WTC-related health conditions.

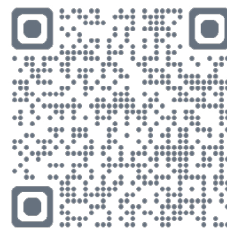

# Responder Benefits





## Monitoring Exams

Responders receive an initial health evaluation and then annual monitoring exams with or without a certified WTC-related health condition.



## Pharmacy Benefits

The Program covers prescription medication used to treat certified WTC-related health conditions that can be filled through:

- Walgreens or Duane Reade Pharmacies for up to 90-day supply
- Other retail pharmacies in the Express Scripts network for up to a 30-day supply
- Express Scripts Home Delivery for up to 90-day supply of maintenance medication
- Accredo Specialty Pharmacy for up to 30-day supply of specialty medication

## Mental Health Benefits

The Program covers treatment services for certified WTC-related mental health conditions, such as anxiety disorders and Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD).

## Benefits Counseling

The WTC Health Program offers benefits counseling to help members access other social services and medical assistance programs including:

- Workers' compensation
- September 11th Victim Compensation Fund
- Other health insurance
- Cancer care assistance
