9.11 World Trade Center Health Program



Survivor Benefits

Are you eligible for no-cost health care related to your 9/11 experience?

You could be eligible for 9/11-related health care if you lived, worked, went to school, or were in the New York City Disaster Area in the days, weeks, or months after 9/11. The World Trade Center (WTC) Health Program provides no-cost medical monitoring and treatment for certified WTC-related health conditions.

Monitoring Exams

Survivors receive one covered initial health evaluation. Once a condition is certified as WTC-related, they are eligible for annual monitoring exams.

Pharmacy Benefits

The Program covers prescription medication used to treat certified WTC-related health conditions that can be filled through:

- Retail: Up to 90-day supply at retail pharmacies in Express Scripts network AND in your primary insurance network
- Home delivery: 90-day supply through home delivery pharmacy in Express Scripts network AND in your primary insurance network
- Specialty: Up to 30-day supply at any pharmacy in Express Scripts network AND in your primary insurance network

Over the past year, Survivors received approximately:

- 29,500 Monitoring or screening exam services
- **32.500** Treatment services
- **10,000** Diagnostic services
- **83,000** prescriptions filled

Mental Health Benefits

The Program covers treatment services for certified WTC-related mental health conditions such as anxiety disorders and Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD).

Benefits Counseling

The WTC Health Program offers benefits counseling to help members access other social services and medical assistance programs including:

- Workers' compensation
- September 11th Victim Compensation Fund
- Other health insurance
- Cancer care assistance
