



About the Program

The World Trade Center (WTC) Health Program is a limited federal health care program that provides medical monitoring and treatment for conditions that are certified as related to a member's exposure on 9/11. You could be eligible for no-cost health care related to certified WTC-related health conditions if you survived or responded to 9/11 in New York City, or responded to the Pentagon and the Shanksville, Pennsylvania sites.

What we do

Health care benefits that eligible members of the WTC Health Program may have access to include:



Pharmacy



Medical Monitoring and Treatment



Mental Health Care

Where you get care

As a member, you may receive care at a Clinical Center of Excellence (CCE) in the New York (NY) metropolitan area or through a Nationwide Provider Network (NPN) across the country.



CCE

If you live in the NY metropolitan area, you will be assigned to a CCE.



NPN

Members who live outside the NY metropolitan area can see WTC Health Program Participating Providers for their WTC-related health care across the country.

Who we serve

The WTC Health Program is dedicated to reaching the over 400,000 people estimated to be affected by 9/11 who may be eligible for coverage.

Currently enrolled in the WTC Health Program:

- Nearly **140,000** members
- Over **86,000** Responders
- Almost **51,000** Survivors



Responder

Responded to, worked, or volunteered in the response and recovery of 9/11.



Survivor

Lived, worked, or went to school or daycare in the NYC Disaster Area during or following 9/11, or were present in the dust or dust cloud on 9/11.
