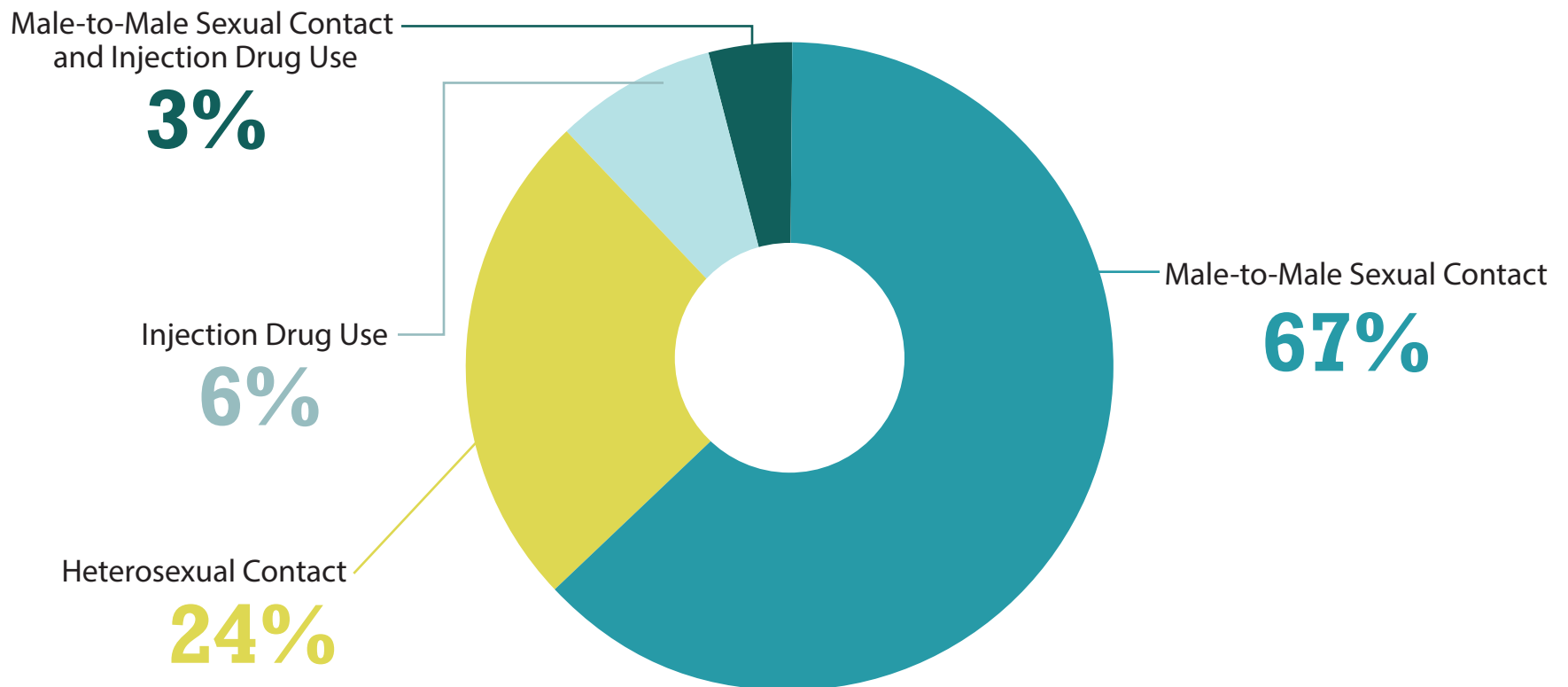


# New HIV Diagnoses in the United States, 2016

In 2016, 39,782 people received an HIV diagnosis. Some groups are more affected than others.

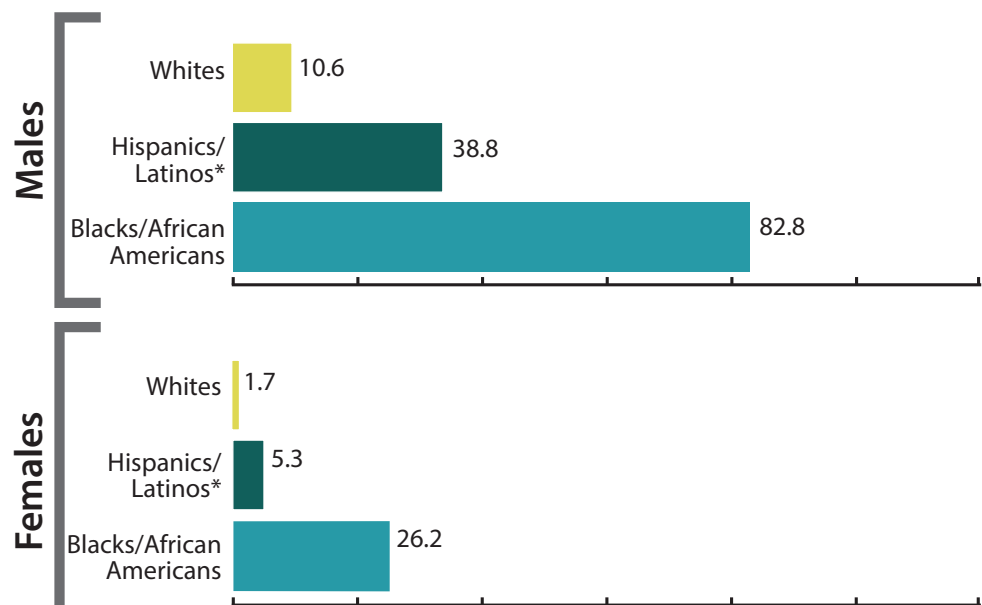
## Route of Transmission



## Race/Ethnicity



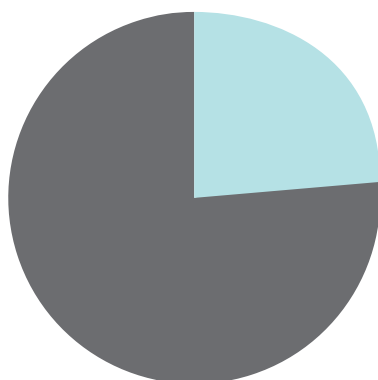
African Americans accounted for **44%** of all new HIV diagnoses.



Number of diagnoses per 100,000 people\*\*

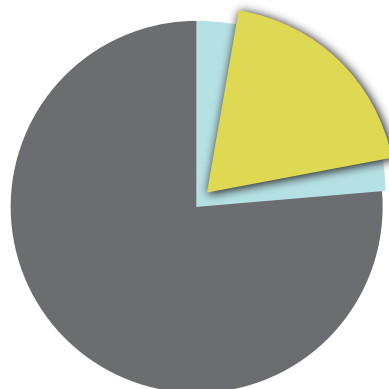
\* Hispanics/Latinos can be of any race. \*\* Persons aged 13 and older.

## Youth



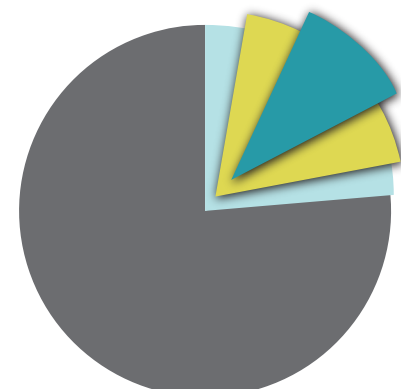
**21%**
