

SUBJECTIVE COGNITIVE DECLINE AMONG AFRICAN AMERICAN ADULTS

2019–2020 Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) Data from African American Adults in 46 States, Puerto Rico, and the District of Columbia: People Aged 45 Years and Older



African American adults aged 45 years and older are experiencing Subjective Cognitive Decline SCD is self-reported MEMORY PROBLEMS that have been GETTING WORSE over the past year.

52% of people with SCD had to give up day-to-day activities



nearly one in two of people

with SCD say it interfered with social activities, work or volunteering





only half of people with SCD have discussed their symptoms with a healthcare provider **52%** of people with SCD need help with household tasks
