2018 is the 20th Anniversary of the CDC's National Comprehensive Cancer Control Program (NCCCP).

Established in 1998, NCCCP provides the **funding, guidance, and technical assistance** that 66 current programs use to design and implement impactful, strategic, and sustainable plans to prevent and control cancer.



1998 - NCCCP established to support 6 programs with cancer control plans



2001 - 14 additional programs funded to plan and implement comprehensive cancer control (CCC) activities



2000 - National Partnership provided the first Leadership Training Institute



2002 - 28 additional programs funded



2003 – Cancer Control P.L.A.N.E.T. launched



2005 – Special Issue of *Cancer Causes and Control* published on comprehensive approaches to cancer control



2010 – Six NCCCP Priorities established



2017 – CDC supports 66 programs with its fourth nationwide CCC funding opportunity



2005 - All 50 states funded for CCC activities



2005 – National Cancer Survivorship Resource Center created



2008 – NCCCP 10th Anniversary highlighted in *Preventing Chronic Disease*



2010 – 13 programs received additional funds to demonstrate policy, systems, and environmental changes
