American Society for Microbiology Public Comment to CLIAC on Workforce Issues February 8, 2006

Good Afternoon. My name is Dave Sewell and I am representing the American Society for Microbiology (ASM). ASM finalized its Survey of Clinical Microbiology Laboratory Workloads, Productivity Rates and Staffing Vacancies, in November, 2005. The purpose of this benchmarking study was to assist clinical microbiology laboratories in measuring themselves against peer groups and determining the level of technical skill required for present and future clinical laboratory procedures. The study also looked at vacancy rates in clinical microbiology laboratories, and the aging of the clinical laboratory workforce. The study was conducted in 2003 and is a project of the Public and Scientific Affairs Board, Committee on Professional Affairs.
