CONTACT LENS HEALTH WEEK OVERVIEW

The week of August 17-21, 2020, marks the seventh annual Contact Lens Health Week! The campaign theme, Road to 2020 Vision begins with contact lens health, emphasizes the importance of healthy contact lens hygiene practices in protecting against serious eye infections and other illnesses. Now more than ever, it's important to wash your hands before handling your contact lenses. Handwashing is an essential first step in the fight against eye infections and COVID-19 transmission. 



Failure to wear, clean, and store your lenses as directed by your eye doctor increases the chance of getting germs in your eyes and causing complications. Contact lens-related eye infections can lead to long-lasting damage but often are preventable. Even minor infections can be painful and disrupt day-to-day life. Your contact lens wear and care habits, supplies, and eye doctor are all essential to keeping your eyes healthy.

The Contact Lens Health Week campaign messages cover three key areas:

- 1. Healthy contact lens wear and care hygiene practices
- 2. Risk associated with improper contact lens use
- 3. Regular visits to an eye care provider
