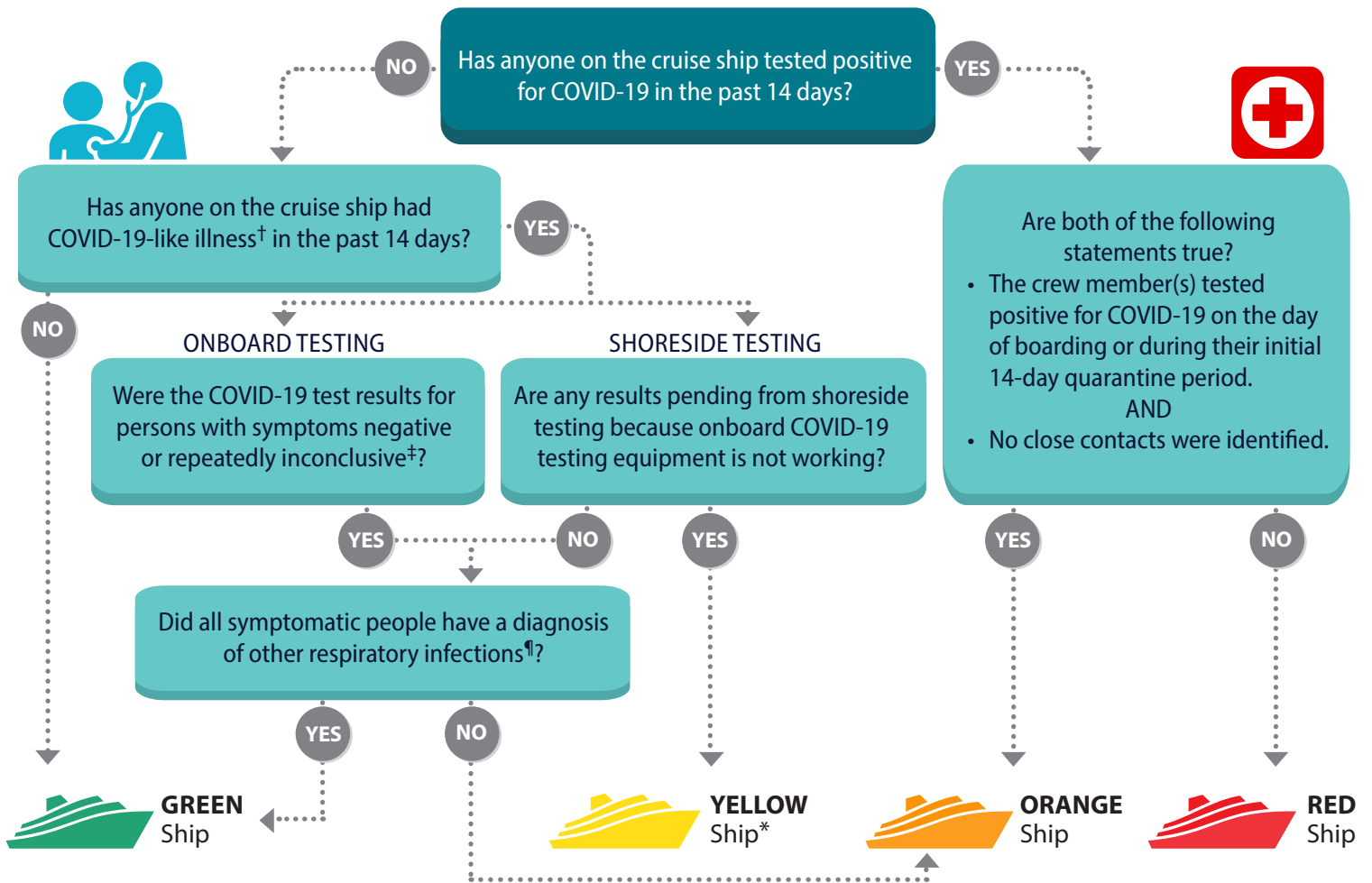


CRUISE SHIP COLOR-CODING STATUS GUIDE

This guide can be used by ship officers, managers, or medical center staff to understand their ship's status under CDC's Conditional Sailing Order (CSO). See ship color criteria at: <http://bit.ly/ShipColorCriteria>



Green Ship Criteria:

- If the ship received ship-to-ship transfers within the past 14 days, crew must have come from a ship that was not Red.
- Land-based crew were immediately quarantined for 14 days upon embarking the ship.
- Ship submitted the Enhanced Data Collection (EDC) During COVID-19 Form[§] daily to CDC.

* If your ship is Yellow:

- If test results are available within one week, re-assess status using results and this flowchart.
- If test results are not available within one week, ship is red.

† COVID-19-like illness means a person has symptoms of COVID-19. Review the symptoms at: www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/symptoms-testing/symptoms.html.

‡ Repeatedly inconclusive or invalid viral test results are those unable to register a positive or negative reading for COVID-19.

¶ Other common respiratory infections identified on cruise ships include influenza (flu), respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), *Streptococcal* pharyngitis, and Legionella.

§ CDC requires daily submission of the EDC reporting form during the Conditional Sailing Order (CSO).
