

Applying CDC's Guideline for Prescribing Opioids: Module 11: Fostering Collaborative Patient-Provider Relationships in Pain Management and Opioid Prescribing

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: The goal of this training is to discuss the importance of building a collaborative relationship between the patient and provider in order to support shared decision making. This training activity will also show what can happen when there is a lack of concordance between a patient and their provider, as well as show how providers can work with their patients to optimize benefits and minimize harms of long-term opioid therapy. Finally, this training will clarify when it is appropriate to coordinate care with mental health care providers and other specialists so as to achieve the most positive patient outcomes.

OBJECTIVES:

At the conclusion of the session, the participant will be able to:

- 1) Discuss ways to strengthen the provider-patient relationship to support shared decision-making in the use of opioids for chronic pain
- 2) Identify potentially negative outcomes that may result from a lack of concordance between provider and patient on opioid therapy
- 3) Identify when to coordinate care with mental health providers and other specialists for patients on opioid therapy
- 4) Discuss ways providers can enhance collaboration with patients to optimize the benefits and minimize the harms from long-term opioid therapy
