

Applying CDC's Guideline for Prescribing Opioids: Module 12: A Nurse's Call to Action for Safer Opioid Prescribing

2. Identify how you can improve patient care by implementing recommendations from the *CDC Guideline for Prescribing Opioids for Chronic Pain*
3. Describe strategies for effective communication between you and your patients experiencing chronic pain
4. List strategies and tools for assessing and documenting chronic pain conditions
5. Identify assessment criteria and treatment options for opioid use disorder (OUD)
6. Describe approaches to improve patient outcomes through participation in quality improvement (QI) and care coordination processes across the integrated healthcare team
