





Activities to be funded

- Assessment of the HIT Landscape in Puerto Rico
- DDI Dollars to implement a centralized registry focusing initially on Zika
- Onboarding of providers to the registry
- Onboarding of Labs and interfaces to the HIE
- Outreach to providers on how to connect and use the registry.

Challenges

Next Steps

- Start the assessment phase of the landscape in Puerto Rico.
- Design and implement the new specialized registry.
- Create the Gap analysis and submit the IAPD-U to fix the findings.
- Continue with the evolution of the registry to make it a more robust and complete one.
- Request funds for qualified and authorized activities.


