

# 64th EIS Conference 2015

## CM2527 — Preaccreditation Statement

### Agenda

The primary purpose of the EIS Conference is to provide a forum for EIS officers to give scientific presentations (oral or poster), increase their knowledge of recent investigations and their significance to public health, maintain and increase their skills in determining the appropriateness of epidemiological methods, presenting and interpreting results clearly, and developing appropriate conclusions and recommendations.

Additional purposes of the EIS Conference include:

1. To provide a forum for EIS Officers and alumni to engage in the scientific exchange of current epidemiologic topics.
2. To highlight the breadth of epidemiologic investigations at CDC.
3. To provide a venue for recruitment of EIS graduates into leadership positions at CDC and State and Local Departments of Health.

These purposes will be accomplished via daily conduct of different scientific lectures (101 total) and display of different scientific posters (24 total) over four days.

### Objectives

1. Discuss the public health importance of the investigations presented.
2. Describe the EIS Officers' role in the development of investigational studies presented.
3. Describe the epidemiologic methods used during the EIS Officer's investigations.
4. Identify the limits on conclusions from available data.
5. Discuss any unresolved issues related to the EIS Officer's investigation.
6. Describe control and prevention recommendations based on investigation results.
