The UNODC is mandated to assist Member States of the United Nations in their struggle against illicit drugs, crime, and terrorism. As a co-sponsor of UNAIDS, UNODC has the global lead and mandate to provide for HIV/AIDS prevention and care among injection drug users, incarcerated population and victims of human trafficking. UNODC is the only organization that has a presence in all the countries in Central Asia and has an existing agreement with Central Asian host governments to work on providing public health services to incarcerated populations, injection drug users and other vulnerable populations.
