This award will directly improve the quality and availability of laboratory testing nationwide, HIV/AIDS opportunistic infection surveillance, the quality of laboratory data, and strengthen infrastructure and human resource capacities. This award will also support the Pasteur Institute to strengthen its own capacity to participate as a reference laboratory in national and international public health evaluations.</p> |

In 2006, the IPCI was designated the laboratory institution in charge of Integrated Disease Surveillance and Response (IDSR) in Cote d'Ivoire by the MOH and Ministry of Scientific Research.
