Purpose of the Award	<p>The purpose of this announcement is to provide continued assistance to the Republic of Mozambique, Ministry of Health, national blood system (Servico Nacional de Sangue or SeNaS) to ensure a safe and adequate blood supply in the Republic of Mozambique. The initiative will involve large-scale prevention efforts, including the rapid establishment and strengthening of safe Blood Services. Prevention of medical transmission of HIV by blood which involves rational transfusion of blood that has been collected from regular, non-remunerated volunteers and appropriately tested based on a quality systems approach for the entire process.</p> <p>The emphasis is to have quality systems in place while at the same time implementing evidence based strategies and improving on program management and evaluation (M&amp;E). The preparation of pediatric blood packs will be a significant component of blood safety activities as children below five years and women of reproductive age receive up to two thirds of the blood.</p>
Single Source Justification Criteria Cited	The Servico Nacional de Sangue (SeNaS) is an Agency of the Government of Mozambique (GOM) Ministry of Health. The SeNaS, the sole provider of blood transfusion services in the Republic of Mozambique, provides comprehensive blood transfusion services for the country. The SeNaS has its central office in the city of

	<p>Maputo and has established centers in all 11 provinces of the country (including Maputo City). The SeNaS provides a full range of services including recruitment and retention on non-remunerated donors, screening of blood for transfusion transmissible infections, such as HIV, Hepatitis B and C and syphilis. The SeNaS is actively involved in training clinicians and nurses in the proper use of blood and blood products.</p> <p>The MOH sets the policies and guidelines for health that are administered by the state, provincial and local governments in each country. In many ways, the MOH mirrors the role CDC plays in the U.S. Establishing agreements with the MOH provides a relationship where HHS/CDC can provide the necessary technical assistance and mentorship needed to insure the MOH can function on its own. Without the direct assistance and technical support to the MOH from HHS/CDC, it is not likely that the countries would develop the capacity to provide the necessary health services or policy and would remain dependent on outside organizations for health care for many years. Additionally, as the MOH builds capacity and sustainability, they will be able to provide the technical and public health assistance and policy guidance to the local indigenous NGO's within their country.</p> <p>SeNaS has been the lead for blood transfusion services in the Republic of Mozambique since it was established. It is the sole official government source in the Republic of Mozambique for providing blood services.</p>
