Purpose of the Award	The Tanzanian National AIDS Control Program (NACP) of the Ministry of Health and Social Welfare (MoHSW) is chartered to coordinate the health-sector response to the HIV

epidemic in Tanzania. HHS/CDC has been working with the NACP on a broad range of HIV related activities since 2002. HHS/CDC wants NACP to continue these activities while orienting them to reflect the increase in the number of partners that are implementing HIV activities and expanding the scope and geographical coverage of HIV-prevention and care interventions in Tanzania. The next strategic phase will focus on increased coordination and management of Regional and District level activities to effectively and sustainably coordinate HIV/AIDS prevention, care and treatment services nationally.

Single Source Justification Reasons Cited

The National AIDS Control Program (NACP) of the Ministry of Health and Social Welfare (MoHSW) was chartered in 1987 by the United Republic of Tanzania to coordinate the health-sector response to the HIV epidemic on the mainland. NACP’s mission is to reduce the incidence of HIV infection and its associated morbidity and mortality. NACP is a leading player in strategic partnerships with other public sectors, private sectors, civil society and communities. NACP also plays a leading role in the prevention of HIV/AIDS and mitigating its impact by overseeing essential interventions and quality care nationally. HHS/CDC has supported NACP since 2002 as it continues to improve and increase its capacity to coordinate the health-sector response to HIV on the mainland. In this next phase, NACP activities emphasize building the capacity of the Regional Health Management Teams (RHMTs) to oversee the administration of HIV services in their regions.

NACP is uniquely positioned, in terms of its charter, existing infrastructure, and credibility to address the HIV/AIDS strategy throughout Tanzania mainland. NACP is currently the only appropriate and qualified organization to conduct a specific set of activities supportive of the CDC/GAP goals for enhancing HIV/AIDS prevention, care, and treatment services in the mainland because of the following:

- The NACP has been directly chartered by the Government of Tanzania to coordinate and implement activities necessary for the control of epidemics, including HIV/AIDS. The NACP, under the mandate of the MoHSW, is the synchronizing agency for efforts aimed at reducing the spread of HIV and for establishing and overseeing standards of care for those infected and affected by HIV/AIDS on Tanzania mainland. No other entity has the support of the Government of Tanzania to perform these activities.
- The NACP is the agency leading the coordination of the national HIV/AIDS response. Continued HHS/CDC support of NACP as they expand their capacity to respond to the national epidemic is directly aligned with “country leadership” objective of the PEPFAR Five-Year Partnership

This Partnership Framework articulates the expected contributions of the Government of the United Republic of Tanzania (URT) and the Government of the United States of America to a dual and effective response to the HIV and AIDS crisis in Tanzania over a five-year period. The Framework is consistent with Tanzania's National Multi-Sectoral Strategic Framework on HIV/AIDS (NMSF 2008-2012) and the Health Sector Strategic Plan III (HSSP 2009-2015), and is intended to align the U.S. President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) and Tanzania's national priorities.
