## **U.S. President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR)**

### **What is PEPFAR?**

The U.S. President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) is a U.S. government global initiative to control the HIV/AIDS pandemic. It is the largest commitment by any nation to combat a single disease. To achieve an AIDS-free generation, PEPFAR works closely with a variety of stakeholders including partner countries, multilateral organizations, civil society, people living with and affected by HIV, the faith community, and the public and private sectors.

PEPFAR is coordinated by the Office of the Global AIDS coordinator and implemented by the following U.S. government entities:

- Department of State
- US Agency for International Development
- Department of Health and Human Services
- Department of Defense
- Department of Commerce
- Department of Labor
- Peace Corps

### **What is PEPFAR's mission?**

To deliver an AIDS-free generation with accountability, transparency, and impact.

### **What are PEPFAR's Priorities?**

With a focus on transparency, accountability, and impact, PEPFAR is actively working with partners to control the HIV/AIDS pandemic to help achieve an AIDS-free generation. PEPFAR is committed to supporting activities that are grounded in science and critical to saving lives and preventing new HIV infections.

PEPFAR's core activities focus on:

- Combination prevention— prevention of mother-child transmission; antiretroviral treatment; provision of condoms; and voluntary medical male circumcision.
- Orphans and vulnerable children— holistic services for families
- Neglected and hard-to-reach populations— pediatrics; adolescent girls; and key populations
- Health systems— human resources for health; commodity procurement, supply chains and laboratory systems
