

# TAP Strategy Gap Prioritization Worksheet



This worksheet has been developed for use by partners in prevention as a component of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention’s (CDC) Targeted Assessment for Prevention (TAP) Strategy. This worksheet may be used by partners to guide in the identification and prioritization of infection prevention gaps following deployment of TAP Facility Assessments.
