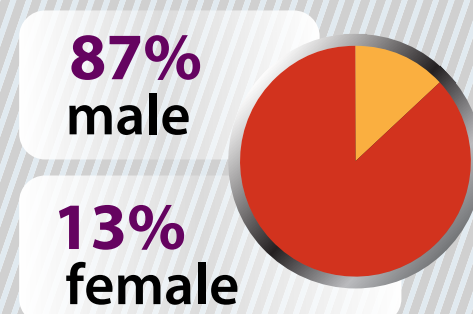
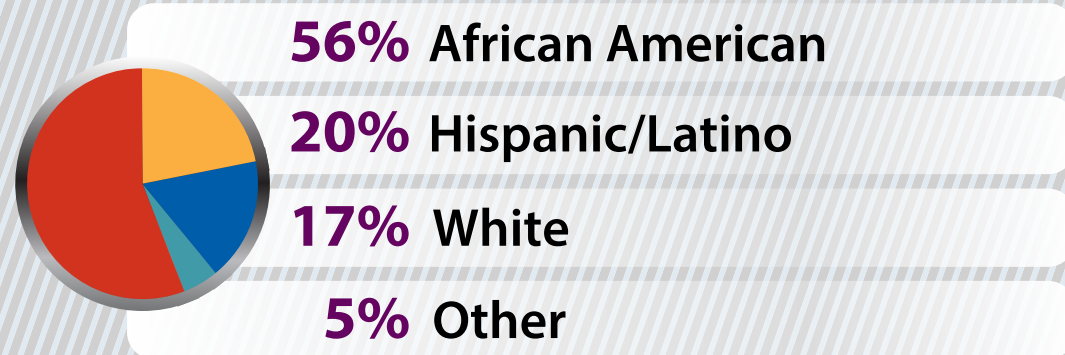

Youth make up **5%** of the more than **1 million people** in the U.S. living with HIV. Schools have direct contact with 50 million youth and play an essential role in helping youth make healthy choices. School programs are vital to achieving an HIV-free generation.

Teen Risk Behaviors

Of high school students in 2015:

41% have ever had sex

12%
have had sex with 4+ people
(during their lifetime)

30%
are currently sexually active
(have had sex during the previous 3 months)

National Youth Risk Behavior Survey, 2015

Risky Behaviors & HIV Prevention

Of currently sexually active students:

43%
did not use a condom
the last time they had sex

21%
used alcohol or drugs
before they last had sex

Of all high school students:

10%
had been tested for HIV
