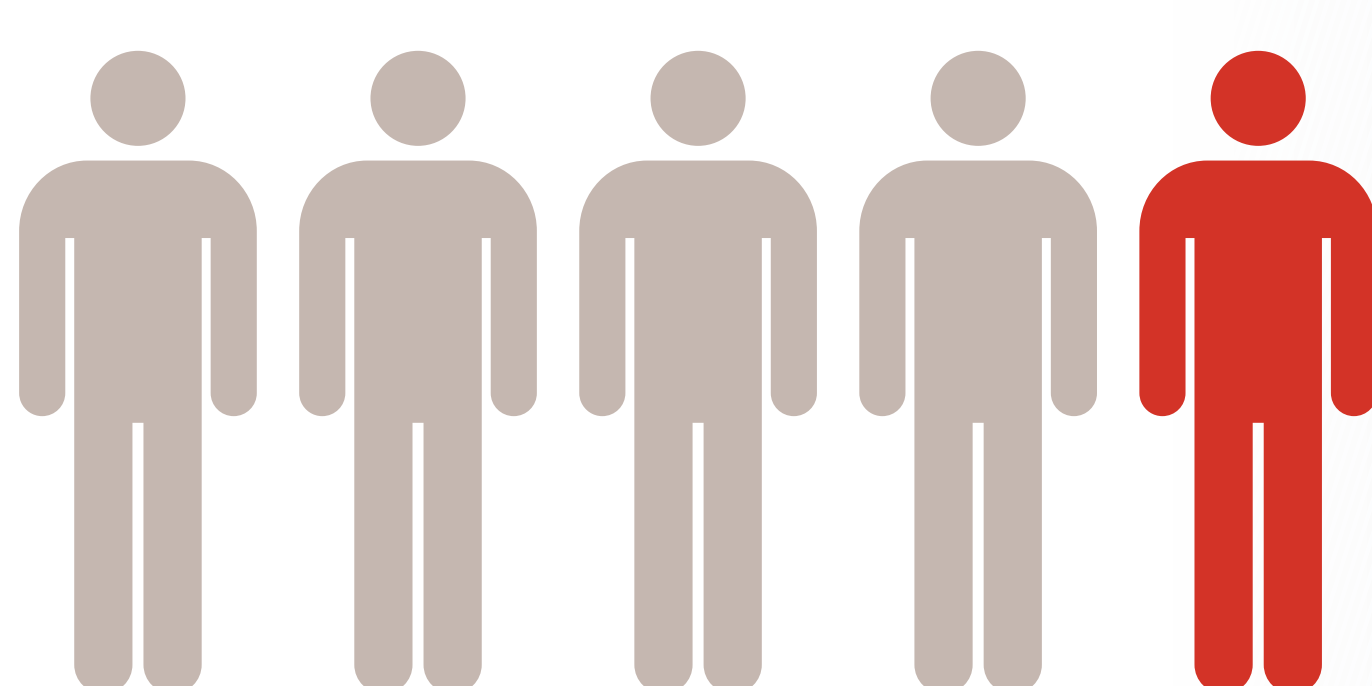


School-based programs play an important role in preventing HIV and other STDs.

There are about **20 million** new STDs each year

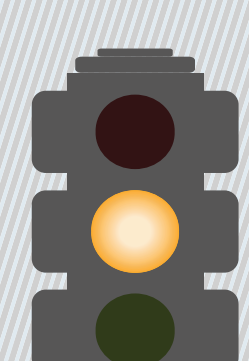


HALF are among youth aged 15-24 years



1 in 5 new HIV infections occur in youth

Effective HIV/STD Prevention Programs



DELAY 1st sexual intercourse



DECREASE number of sex partners



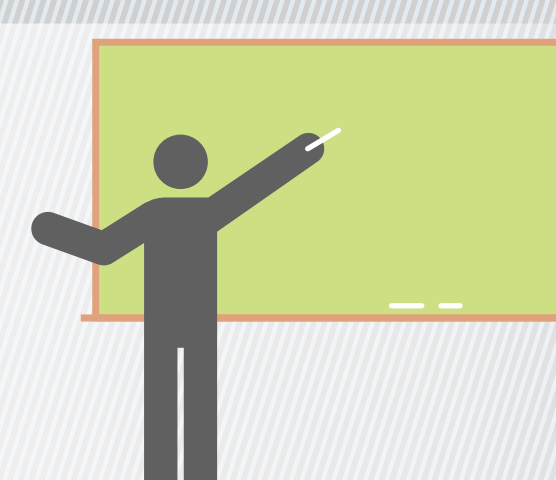
DO NOT increase likelihood of having sex



INCREASE condom and contraceptive use

Characteristics of Effective HIV/STD Prevention Programs

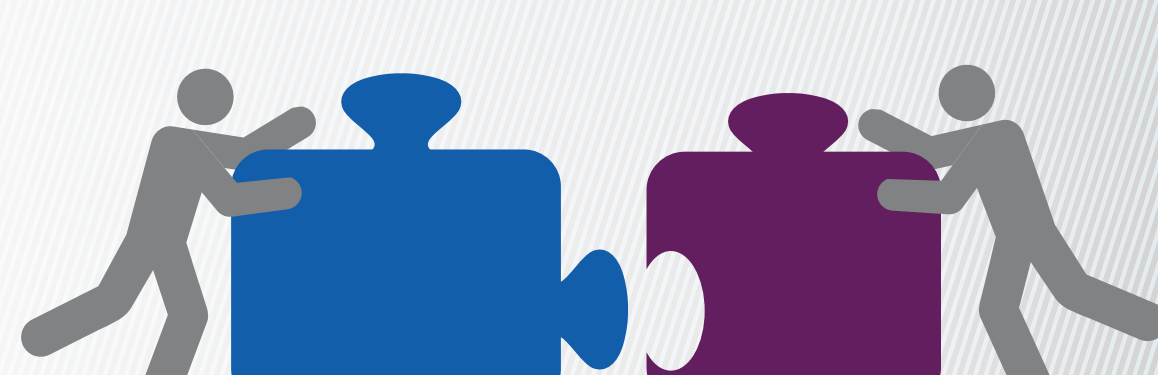
1 Delivered by trained instructors



2 Use materials that are age- and culturally-appropriate and medically accurate



3 Include skill-building lessons



4 Take place in a school environment supportive of healthy behaviors



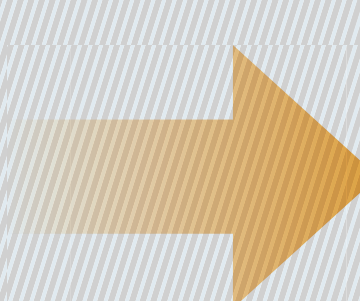
5 Involve parents, youth-serving organizations, and health organizations



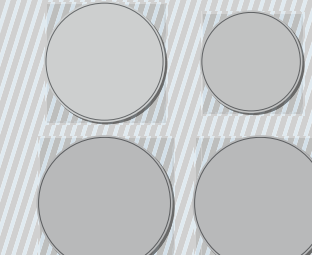
