CDC's Division of HIV/AIDS Prevention provides resources that educate people about HIV and help partners deliver effective prevention and treatment programs. Get information about HIV transmission, prevention, and testing; data about HIV in the United States; fact sheets about HIV among specific populations; resources for health care providers; and more. Download materials for promoting HIV awareness days.

*Act Against AIDS* campaigns focus on raising HIV awareness among all Americans and reducing the risk of infection among the most-affected populations. Get campaign resources such as videos, posters, and web banners to promote testing, encourage prevention, and help people living with HIV stay in care. The site also includes resources for health care providers on HIV testing and care.

## HIV Risk Reduction Tool: [www.cdc.gov/hivrisk](http://www.cdc.gov/hivrisk)

CDC's HIV Risk Reduction Tool (BETA version) helps people learn about their risk of getting or transmitting HIV and how to lower that risk. Users can get customizable content based on their gender, their HIV status, and the gender of their sexual partners. They can also compare the risk of specific sexual activities and see how different factors such as using a condom affect that risk.

GetTested provides information about testing for HIV, other sexually transmitted diseases (STDs), and viral hepatitis. Visitors can find free, fast, and confidential testing locations near them.

## AtlasPlus: [www.cdc.gov/nchhstp/atlas](http://www.cdc.gov/nchhstp/atlas)

CDC's AtlasPlus allows users to analyze more than 15 years of HIV, STD, viral hepatitis, and tuberculosis (TB) data at national, state, and county levels. Users can create and export custom maps, tables, and charts, explore data by population groups, and look at trends.




## National Prevention Information Network: <https://npin.cdc.gov>
