
Diagnoses by Race/Ethnicity

In 2018, Blacks/African Americans **and** Hispanics/Latinos accounted for **69% of HIV diagnoses** but comprised only 31% of the U.S.** population.




HIV Diagnoses Trends from 2014–2018*



Diagnoses Among MSM by Race/Ethnicity in 2018*




HIV Diagnoses by Region
