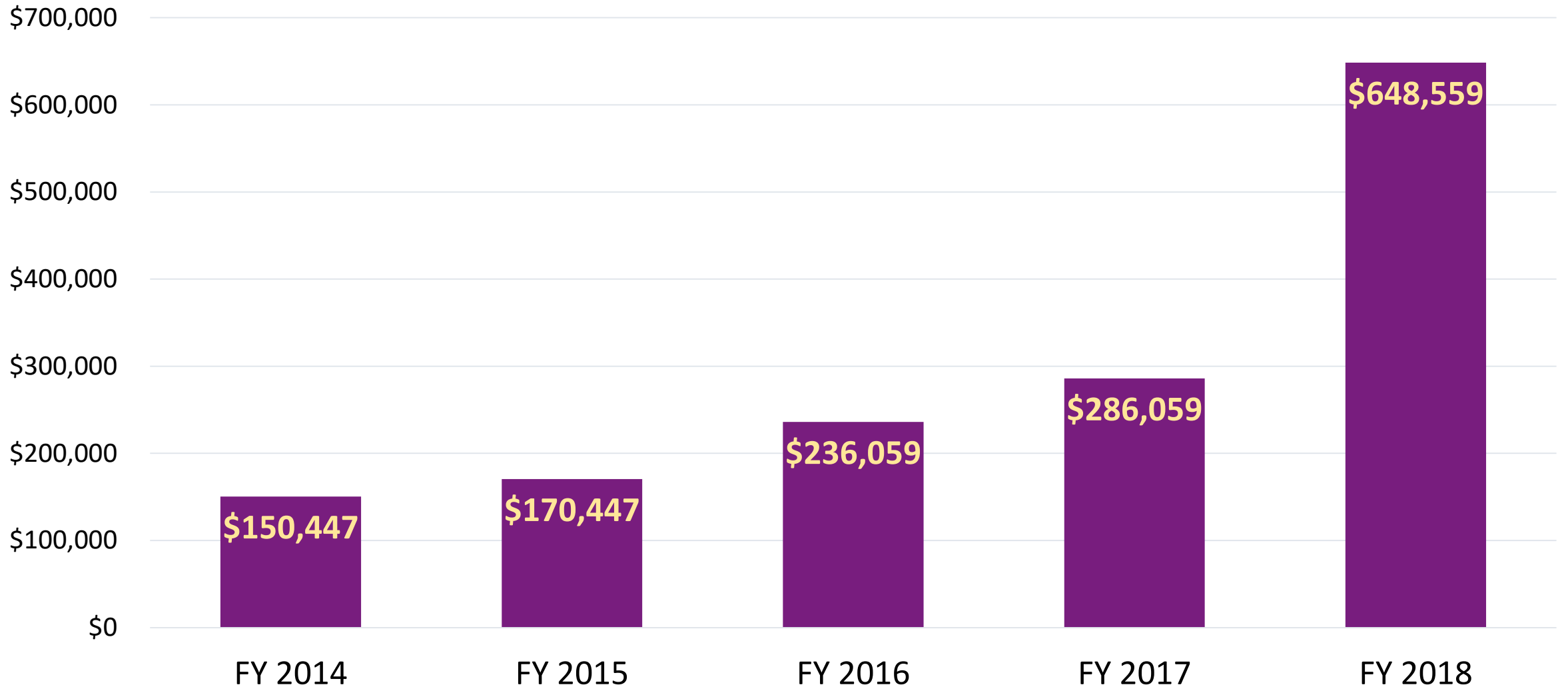

FY 2014 - FY 2018 Injury Appropriation (in millions)

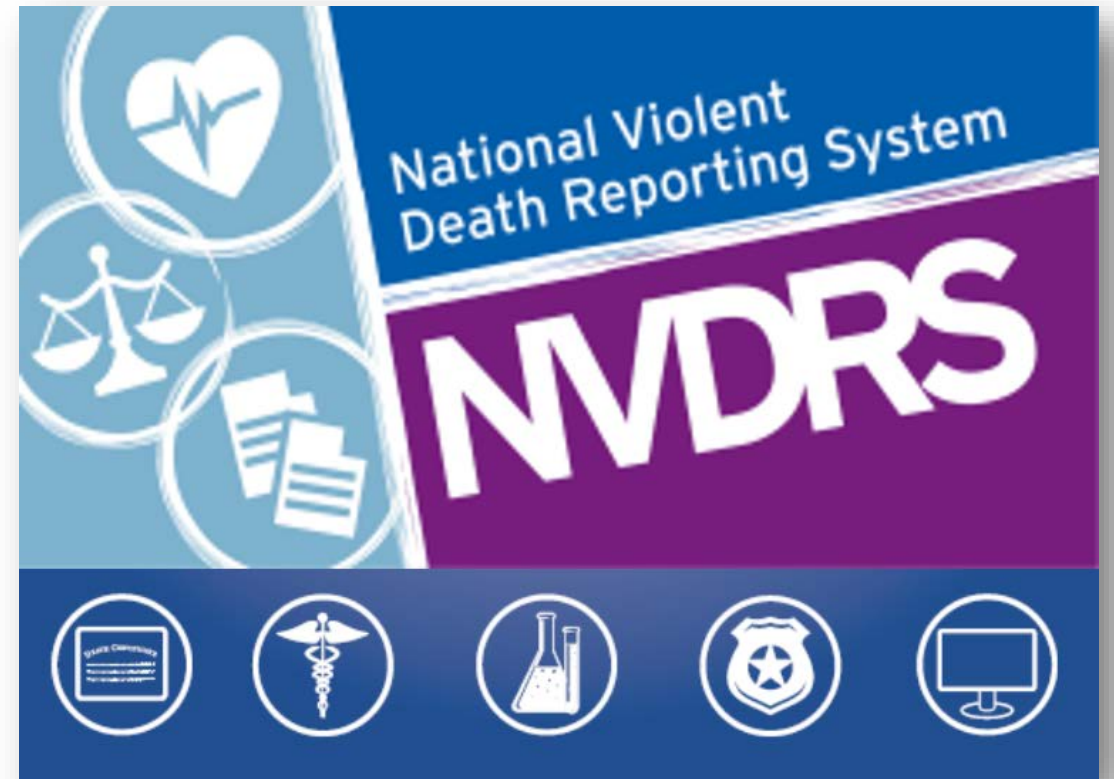


FY 2018 Omnibus

- CDC funding increased by \$1.1 billion
- Injury Center funding increased by \$362 million
 - Rape Prevention and Education (+5m)
 - National Violent Death Reporting System (+7.6m)
 - Opioid Overdose Prevention and Surveillance (+350m)
- All other budget lines remained level with FY17



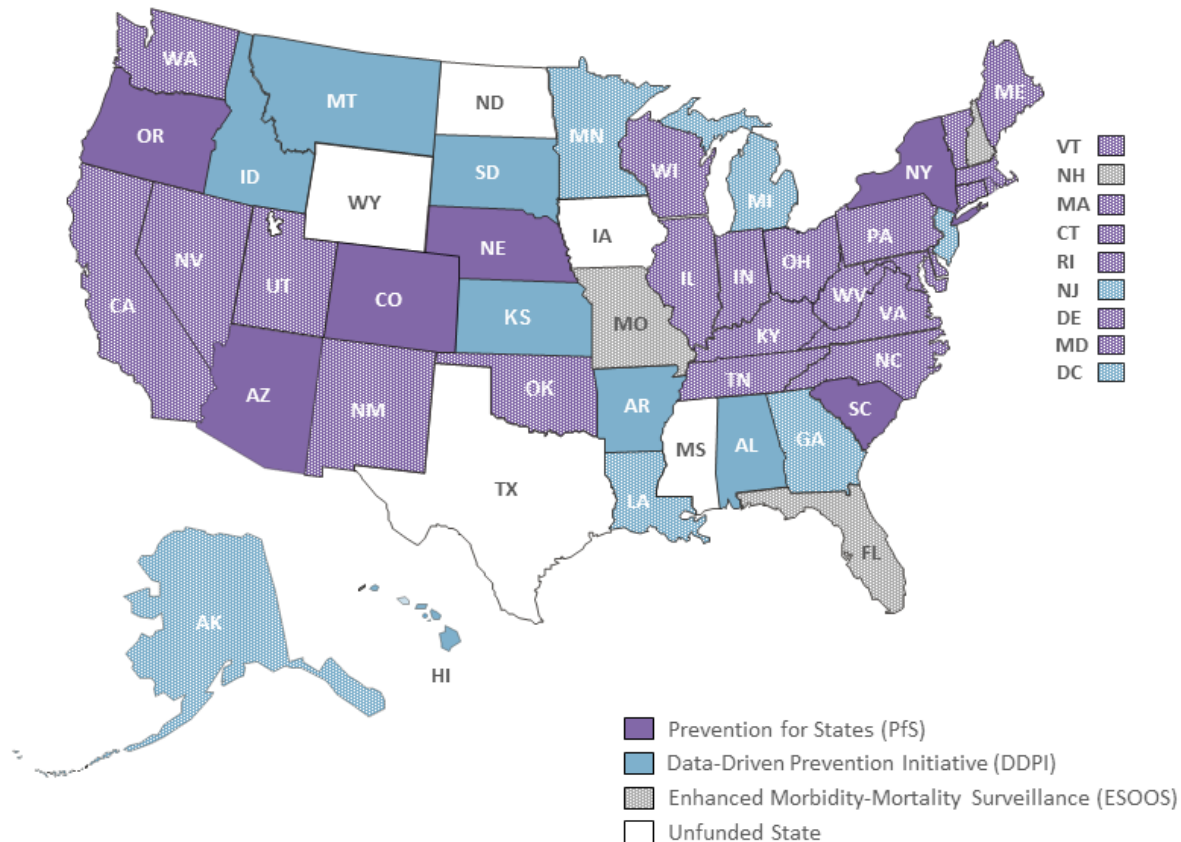
RPE and NVDRS Funding Increases for FY 2018



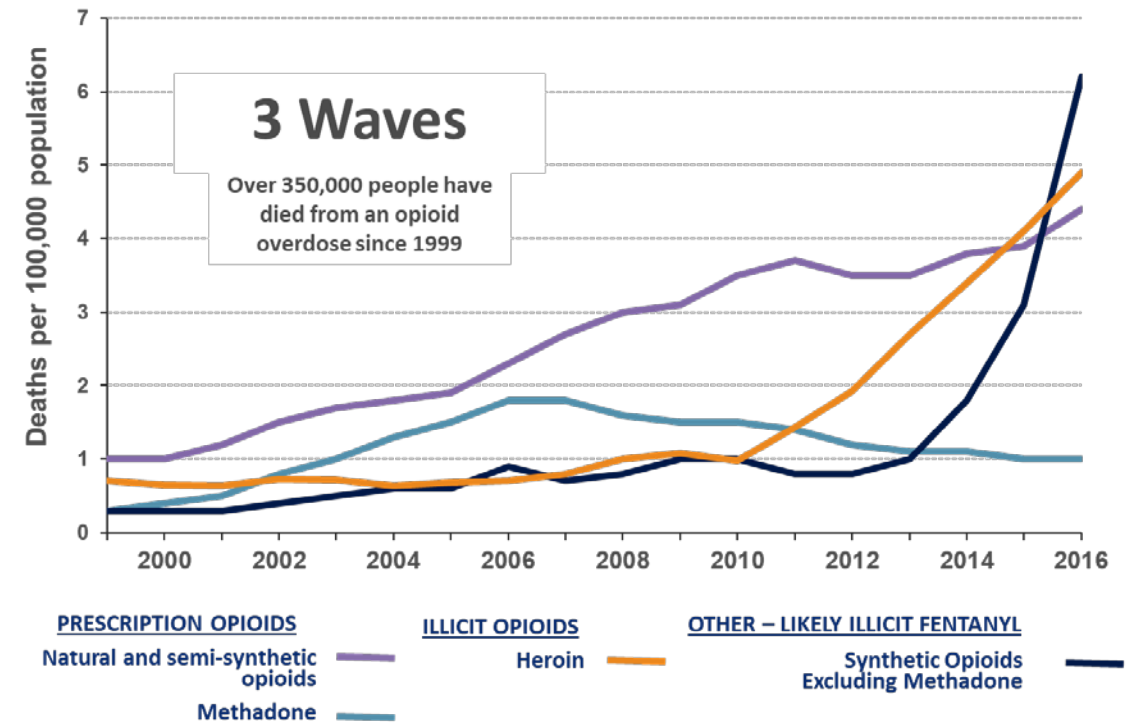
