Two-year fellowship assignments begin in July 2022


LLS fellows

- Serve in public health laboratories while building leadership skills
- Collaborate with multidisciplinary teams and serve as disease detectives alongside CDC's Epidemic Intelligence Service (EIS)
- Conduct cutting-edge laboratory research
- Conduct comprehensive laboratory safety and risk assessments
- Evaluate laboratory quality management systems
- Communicate findings and formulate recommendations from laboratory research, investigations, and studies
- Participate in public health field investigations

Who can apply?

1. Early-career laboratory scientists with a PhD in a laboratory-related discipline
2. United States citizenship or permanent residency
