

## TRAVELING ABROAD? PROTECT AGAINST MEASLES.



Before you travel internationally, make sure you are up to date on your measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) shots.

## **INFANTS** 6-11 MONTHS OLD



1 early dose of MMR now \*\*

## **CHILDREN 12** MONTHS & OLDER with no evidence of immunity\*



1 dose of MMR now 1 dose at least 28 days later

## **TEENS & ADULTS**

with no evidence of immunity\*



1 dose of MMR now 1 dose at least 28 days later

\*Evidence of immunity includes one of the following: Written documentation of adequate vaccination, laboratory evidence of immunity, laboratory confirmation of measles, birth in the United States before 1957.

\*\* Follow the recommended schedule and get another dose at 12-15 months and a final dose at 4-6 years.

Plan to be fully vaccinated against measles at least 2 WEEKS before you travel. If your trip is less than 2 weeks away, you should still get a dose of MMR vaccine.
